Time to say goodbye...

Sadly, as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic, we have had to say goodbye to several long-standing groups at the village hall, including Short Mat Bowls, who held their final meeting (outdoors) in May. We



would like to thank them for their loyalty and support over the years and wish them all well. We have also lost Mini Monkeys, Rugby Tots and Multiple Mayhem, meaning that there are no longer any groups operating at the hall specifically for the little ones. If you know of anybody who might be interested in setting up a toddler group or who runs a similar franchise, please do put them in touch with us - I am sure there are plenty of Mums in the village who would be very grateful!



Have you got yours yet?

With the help of volunteers, to whom we are very grateful, the Parish Council have now delivered speed awareness wheelie bin stickers to almost 250 houses in the village. Everyone whose bins are placed on a main thoroughfare for collection should have received an envelope containing a letter and two stickers - one for each of the main bins. We hope that the additional awareness created on bin collection day(s) will support the

campaign to reduce the speed of vehicles passing through the village. We have a number of spare stickers at the village hall, so if you would like an additional sticker for a brown bin or perhaps live somewhere not on a main road but would like to help drive the message home to everyone in a car, on foot or bicycle that we want to keep our village safe, then please call in during office hours to pick your stickers up.

By the time of publication, our first volunteers will have received their training and begun our Community Speed Watch. We will bring you updates of their findings on our social media and in the next edition of the Mardler. More volunteers are needed - if you can spare an hour or two now and again, please get in touch with the Parish Clerk.





It is easy to forget that Swanton Morley village hall, whilst a charity, is a business like any other and has suffered at the hands of the Coronavirus pandemic. As a community hub, regular groups have not been allowed to meet and as a hospitality venue, the bar has not been allowed to open and celebrations have been paused for everyone. The hall has been very
