Village Hall Extension

Progress

In our last newsletter, we proudly reported that the Council Parish had been successful in obtaining £100,000 grant from the **Community Construction Fund** to extend the Village Hall. The work on this much needed extension will commence on 18th March and will last for approximately 16 weeks. Minimal disruption is anticipated as the majority of the work is to the outside of the building. All users of the hall which will be affected have been contacted and all other bookings will continue as normal. Whilst the hall is a community building, the construction site will be off limits to members of the public. We respectfully request that the construction company be allowed to work without the hall on interruption.

Allotment Vacancies

There are 4 allotments vacant on the Manns Lane allotment site. Allotments are a great way to grow your own organic fruit and vegetables, they are engaging for families and good for community spirit. Gardening is also a proven form of exercise and can reduce stress levels.

Increasing Community Resilience – Help Wanted!

The Parish Council is in the process of putting together a plan for the village which can be used in an emergency, as a short term measure should emergency services not be able to assist. Severe weather, power failure, loss of water or flooding can affect a community. Depending on the scale of the event, it can be some time before outside help arrives.

A Community Emergency Plan (CEP) combines local knowledge and forward planning to help the community help itself before outside

assistance arrives and help the community work effectively with emergency responders.

Developing a CEP will help keep disruption to a minimum, safeguard the most vulnerable and speed a return to normality.

We therefore need to identify those in the village who can offer assistance in an emergency, and those who would need assistance from us. To help us with this we will shortly be delivering a short questionnaire to each household. We will then collect the



questionnaire two weeks later. We are appealing for help in distributing and collecting this questionnaire, because the better the return, the better the plan we can put together to help those who need it most. Lincoln House Development Update

In our last newsletter, we reported that the Lincoln House site had submitted three planning applications.

An extension to the community centre. The Parish Council expressed no objections to this application and the development has since been granted planning permission.

An additional 27 assisted living units. The Parish Council objected to this application in its current form on the grounds of poor vehicular access to the site. This application has since been withdrawn.

A 30 bed dementia unit. The Parish Council objected to this application in its current form on the grounds of poor vehicular access to the site and the proximity to the Dereham Road. This application was put to the planning committee at Breckland District Council and was refused permission on 29th January.

The Parish Council recognises the need for dementia care, but any development in Swanton Morley needs to be in keeping with our village.

Better Broadband for the Village

Using a network of different sites across the county, WiSpire

intends to transmit a wireless

broadband connection into the heart of the local area via Swanton Morley church tower. Different residential packages will be offered and each contract is only 30 days allowing the flexibility in changing service and freedom of not being tied in for a long period. As WiSpire don't use the copper cables from the exchange, you don't need to have your current BT phone line to receive the connection. 2013/2014 Parish Precept

On 21st January, the Parish Council agreed its 2013/2014 budget and associated precept. Conscious that household budgets are tight for many people at the moment, the Parish Council reduced its precept by 0.88% to £39,251.28. Regrettably, due to changes in legislation relating to of calculation council tax support, this has still resulted in an increase of 1.19% for each property. This equates to a total payment of £59.91 per Band D Property.
